



## Prayer – Part II (Solid Food)

Like I said in Spiritual Milk; Prayer is communicating with the Lord (Father, Son and the Holy Spirit) from your heart. When man communicates there is a format he follows. When he picks up the phone the first thing he will say is 'Hello' and when he finishes he says 'bye'. When he writes a letter there is a format he follows which includes a reference no., date, to, address, reference topic, matter, signature etc.

So also do prayer and this format has been given to us by Lord Jesus in 'Our Father'. A perfect prayer should have the following:

- a) Acknowledging God,
- b) Acknowledging His authority,
- c) Thanking Him,
- d) Praising Him,
- e) Humbling ourselves before Him,
- f) Asking Him for our needs according to His will for He knows best and lastly
- g) Believing that we have already received it, thank Him.

Prayers are always answered by God only if the communication is clear. The communication gets disrupted when we do not keep His Word.

### James 5:16

*<sup>13</sup>Is any one of you in trouble? He should pray. Is anyone happy? Let him sing songs of praise. <sup>14</sup>Is any one of you sick? He should call the elders of the church to pray over him and anoint him with oil in the name of the Lord. <sup>15</sup>And **the prayer offered in faith will make the sick person well; the Lord will raise him up. If he has sinned, he will be forgiven. <sup>16</sup>Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. **The prayer of a righteous man is powerful and effective.*****

### Psalm 34

- <sup>15</sup> **The eyes of the LORD are on the righteous and his ears are attentive to their cry;***
- <sup>16</sup> **the face of the LORD is against those who do evil, to cut off the memory of them from the earth.***
- <sup>17</sup> **The righteous cry out, and the LORD hears them; he delivers them from all their troubles.***
- <sup>18</sup> **The LORD is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit.***
- <sup>19</sup> **A righteous man may have many troubles, but the LORD delivers him from them all;***
- <sup>20</sup> **he protects all his bones, not one of them will be broken.***
- <sup>21</sup> **Evil will slay the wicked; the foes of the righteous will be condemned.***
- <sup>22</sup> **The LORD redeems his servants; no one will be condemned who takes refuge in him.***

Like the Lord showed me since I am in the computer industry, prayer is like a TCP/IP communication. You need to be in the same subnet mask to communicate. (You have to be in righteous with God for God is righteous. **Psalm 118:19, 20** 'Open for me the gates of righteousness; I will enter and give thanks to the LORD. This is the gate of the LORD through which the righteous may enter'.) The subnet mask is a narrow subnet mask. (**Matthew 7:13** "Enter through the narrow gate. For wide is the gate and broad is the road that leads to destruction, and many enter through it.") TCP/IP is not just one protocol but a bundle of protocols that work together and they have a format too.

The communication happens like this. When a Server Host (God) is to be accessed for data (blessings) first its record (God's will) from the DNS Server (Word of God - Bible) is confirmed. Then the client host (human)



searches for the presences of the Server Host. Once the presence is acknowledged it sends a request, the Server Host answers the request and sends the data. The protocol to find the presence in TCP/IP is the icmp (thanksgiving) protocol then comes the udp (praise) a broadcast protocol. (**Psalm 100:4** *'Enter his gates with thanksgiving and his courts with praise; give thanks to him and praise his name'*). Even when the data is continually being sent in between the client host keeps sending an acknowledgement request to make sure the Server Host is present or still connected (daily prayer) and after the data is sent again the icmp protocol confirms the delivery. In case the IP of the client host (human's spirit) is not in the same subnet mask as the Server Host then it requires a Gateway IP to route (Christ – for He said in **John 10:9** *'I am the gate; whoever enters through me will be saved. He will come in and go out, and find pasture.'* The Lord Jesus is our eternal intercessor. He intercedes for us directly or through His Spirit; the Holy Spirit. Since man is in sin and has not over come it totally. It is only in the Day of the Lord that death will be defeated and man will be totally free from sin. On the cross Jesus has already won it for us in Spirit, we will only bring it into the natural.) Therefore we will always need the Gateway (Christ and His Spirit) to communicate to the Server Host.

### **Hebrews 7**

*<sup>23</sup>Now there have been many of those priests, since death prevented them from continuing in office; <sup>24</sup>but because Jesus lives forever, he has a permanent priesthood. <sup>25</sup>Therefore he is able to save completely those who come to God through him, because he always lives to intercede for them.*

### **Romans 8**

*<sup>32</sup>He who did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us all—how will he not also, along with him, graciously give us all things?*

*<sup>34</sup>Who is he that condemns? Christ Jesus, who died—more than that, who was raised to life—is at the right hand of God and is also interceding for us.*

### **Isaiah 53:12**

*Therefore will I divide him a portion with the great, and he shall divide the spoil with the strong; because he hath poured out his soul unto death: and he was numbered with the transgressors; and he bare the sin of many, and made intercession for the transgressors*

### **Romans 8**

*<sup>26</sup>In the same way, the Spirit helps us in our weakness. We do not know what we ought to pray for, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with groans that words cannot express. <sup>27</sup>And he who searches our hearts knows the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints in accordance with God's will.*

We can also go via another gateway (human), which will in turn connect, to the main Host via the main Gateway (Christ). For this the intermediate gateway should be alive. A dead gateway will not route the request. Even when a man or woman of God is asked to prayer or intercede for another person he should do so along with the Lord. Do not say 'I will prayer' but 'I will intercede with the Lord'.

### **1 Samuel 7:5**

*Then Samuel said, "Assemble all Israel at Mizpah and I will intercede with the LORD for you."*

### **1 Kings 13:6**

*Then the king said to the man of God, "Intercede with the LORD your God and pray for me that my hand may be restored." So the man of God interceded with the LORD, and the king's hand was restored and became as it was before.*

What I have found in life is the prayers of the living are answered. Christ is living so is His Spirit, man and woman of God who is living their prayer is immediately answered. Why then knock on doors that are shut?

One thing should be very clear that no one can go to the Father without Christ. He was the one who interceded in the start when mankind fell into sin and even now He does so in front of God our Father for it is God the Father who is the source of all living and all things.



Why I recommend not praying through the dead is giving in the parable that Jesus spoke in the Gospel according to Luke about the Rich man and Lazarus.

After the rich man had died and went to hell while Lazarus went to the side of Abraham, he was burning in hell and pleaded Abraham for help via Lazarus. After being refused he wanted to warn his brothers via Lazarus for this too Abraham refused.

#### **Luke 16**

*<sup>27</sup>"He answered, 'Then I beg you, father, send Lazarus to my father's house, <sup>28</sup>for I have five brothers. Let him warn them, so that they will not also come to this place of torment.'*

*<sup>29</sup>"Abraham replied, 'They have Moses and the Prophets; let them listen to them.'*

*<sup>30</sup>" 'No, father Abraham,' he said, 'but if someone from the dead goes to them, they will repent.'*

*<sup>31</sup>"He said to him, '**If they do not listen to Moses and the Prophets, they will not be convinced even if someone rises from the dead.**' "*

You will only understand better when you understand what heaven, hell etc. are? (This teaching I will put up when the Lord tells me. I actually sat to write on a topic connecting to it, but then was led to write about Prayer - Solid Food.)

When Jesus was on earth He always prayed to the Father. Even He told others to pray to the Father and showed them how to prayer to the Father.

#### **Matthew 6:6**

*<sup>6</sup>But when you pray, go into your room, **close the door and pray to your Father**, who is unseen. Then your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you.*

#### **Luke 6:12**

*<sup>12</sup>One of those days Jesus went out to a mountainside to pray, and **spent the night praying to God.***

There is no scripture where Jesus said prayer to me; He said 'when you pray to the Father in My name'. For He was the sacrifice or the ransom for our sins and when we pray calling on the name of 'Jesus' we are reminding God about the sacrifice of Jesus or the ransom that has already been paid.

#### **John 14**

*<sup>12</sup>I tell you the truth, anyone who has faith in me will do what I have been doing. He will do even greater things than these, because I am going to the Father. <sup>13</sup>And **I will do whatever you ask in my name**, so that the Son may bring glory to the Father. <sup>14</sup>**You may ask me for anything in my name, and I will do it.***

#### **John 15**

*<sup>16</sup>You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit—fruit that will last. **Then the Father will give you whatever you ask in my name.***

#### **John 16**

*<sup>23</sup>In that day you will no longer ask me anything. I tell you the truth, **my Father will give you whatever you ask in my name.** <sup>24</sup>Until now you have not asked for anything in my name. **Ask and you will receive, and your joy will be complete.***

Why Jesus did not asked them to pray to Him, He was Lord, the Son of God?

When Jesus was on earth He was human and He knew that we should not pray or worship any human not even to an angel.

#### **Revelation 19**

*<sup>9</sup>Then the angel said to me, "Write: 'Blessed are those who are invited to the wedding supper of the Lamb!' " And he added, "These are the true words of God."*



***<sup>10</sup>At this I fell at his feet to worship him. But he said to me, "Do not do it! I am a fellow servant with you and with your brothers who hold to the testimony of Jesus. Worship God! For the testimony of Jesus is the spirit of prophecy."***

### **Revelation 20**

***<sup>8</sup>I, John, am the one who heard and saw these things. And when I had heard and seen them, I fell down to worship at the feet of the angel who had been showing them to me. <sup>9</sup>But he said to me, "Do not do it! I am a fellow servant with you and with your brothers the prophets and of all who keep the words of this book. Worship God!"***

Now that He is in Spirit we can pray to Him (When He appeared to Paul He did not appear in human form but as light, but to the other and even today He appears to us in human form, just because we have made a picture of Him in our minds). When we pray to the Lord it is the same Jesus the Son of God and He and the Father can not be distinguished as different.

I simply tell people when you have the Lord Jesus Christ (who is on the topmost post, for no one has seen the Father other than the Lord and is always there to intercede for you) why do you need to knock on other doors. The only need required is the change in your heart, even if you have been a great sinner it does not matter. What matters is, is your heart ready to change and accept God now? If so, then today is the day of your salvation you will become righteous with the sacrifice of Jesus on the cross and all your prayers will be answered.

Being righteous means, being right in the eyes of God. This means living our life and doing all things according to the Word of God. When we do not obey God and break His commandments God hides His face from us and does not answer our prayers.

### **Isaiah 59**

***<sup>1</sup>Surely the arm of the LORD is not too short to save,  
nor his ear too dull to hear.***

***<sup>2</sup>But your iniquities have separated  
you from your God;  
your sins have hidden his face from you,  
so that he will not hear.***

***<sup>3</sup>For your hands are stained with blood,  
your fingers with guilt.  
Your lips have spoken lies,  
and your tongue mutters wicked things.***

### **Isaiah 1**

***<sup>15</sup>When you spread out your hands in prayer,  
I will hide my eyes from you;  
even if you offer many prayers,  
I will not listen.***

***Your hands are full of blood;  
<sup>16</sup>wash and make yourselves clean.  
Take your evil deeds  
out of my sight!***

***Stop doing wrong,  
<sup>17</sup>learn to do right!  
Seek justice,  
encourage the oppressed.  
Defend the cause of the fatherless,  
plead the case of the widow.***

Please do not do what the Jews did, they followed the Law of Moses to the letter but did not understand it in spirit. Those who follow the Word of God in physical and not in Spirit will have to endure it also in the physical. (Read Deuteronomy chp.28 blessings and curses.)

### **Galatians 2**

*<sup>16</sup>know that a man is not justified by observing the law, but by faith in Jesus Christ. So we, too, have put our faith in Christ Jesus that we may be justified by faith in Christ and not by observing the law, because by observing the law no one will be justified.*

God does not answer prayers for many reasons and all the reasons are written in the Bible. I will list below the reasons:

- ❖ When we do not help others who are unfortunate, according to the blessing that God has blessed us, then God too does not answer our prayers. These include the poor, the orphans, the widows, the sick etc...

### **Proverbs 21:13**

*<sup>13</sup> If a man shuts his ears to the cry of the poor, he too will cry out and not be answered.*

- ❖ Men who are married and do not love their wives, their prayers are not answered (vice-versa also applies).

### **Malachi 2**

*<sup>13</sup> Another thing you do: You flood the LORD's altar with tears. You weep and wail because he no longer pays attention to your offerings or accepts them with pleasure from your hands. <sup>14</sup> You ask, "Why?" It is because the LORD is acting as the witness between you and the wife of your youth, because you have broken faith with her, though she is your partner, the wife of your marriage covenant.*

- ❖ Prayers are also not answered if there is un-forgiveness in our heart.

### **Matthew 5**

*<sup>23</sup>Therefore, if you are offering your gift at the altar and there remember that your brother has something against you, <sup>24</sup>leave your gift there in front of the altar. First go and be reconciled to your brother; then come and offer your gift.*

### **Mark 11**

*<sup>25</sup>And when you stand praying, if you hold anything against anyone, forgive him, so that your Father in heaven may forgive you your sins."*

- ❖ When we have other gods in our lives or made other things or people king of our lives; like our work, beauty, money, children, partner, power etc. God does not answer our prayers. Like the Lord turned His face from the Israelites when they worshiped other gods and when they wanted a man as king over them. Not only God did not hear their prayers for a long time but also delivered them into the hands of their enemy.
- ❖ God does not answer our prayers when we have pride in our heart. In the parable given by Jesus in the Gospel according to Luke, He explained why the prayers of the Pharisee were not heard and that of the Publican (a tax collector) was heard.

### **Luke 18**

*<sup>10</sup>Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. <sup>11</sup>The Pharisee stood up and prayed about himself: 'God, I thank you that I am not like other men—robbers, evildoers, adulterers—or even like this tax collector. <sup>12</sup>I fast twice a week and give a tenth of all I get.' <sup>13</sup>But the tax collector stood at a distance. He would not even look up to heaven, but beat his breast and said, 'God, have mercy on me, a sinner.'*



***14**"I tell you that this man, rather than the other, went home justified before God. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted."*

- ❖ God does not answer our prayers, when we think we are wise in our hearts. When we reject the knowledge of God (Word of God) but dwell in the knowledge of this world.

#### **Job 37**

***23** The Almighty is beyond our reach and exalted in power; in his justice and great righteousness, he does not oppress.  
**24** Therefore, men revere him, for does he not have regard for all the wise in heart?*

#### **Hosea 4:6**

***6** my people are destroyed from lack of knowledge. "Because you have rejected knowledge, I also reject you as my priests; because you have ignored the law of your God, I also will ignore your children."*

- ❖ God does not answer our prayers when we do not have the fear of the Lord and cherish sin in our hearts.

#### **Psalm 66**

***16** Come and listen, all you who fear God; let me tell you what he has done for me.  
**17** I cried out to him with my mouth; his praise was on my tongue.  
**18** If I had cherished sin in my heart, the Lord would not have listened;  
**19** but God has surely listened and heard my voice in prayer.*

- ❖ God does not answer our prayers when we ask of Him things out of the lust of our flesh things for the pleasure of the body, but which harms our spirit and things that harm others

#### **James 4**

***2**You want something but don't get it. You kill and covet, but you cannot have what you want. You quarrel and fight. You do not have, because you do not ask God. **3**When you ask, you do not receive, because you ask with wrong motives, that you may spend what you get on your pleasures.*

#### **Matthew 6**

***19**"Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. **20**But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where moth and rust do not destroy, and where thieves do not break in and steal. **21**For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.*

#### **Matthew 7**

***9**"Which of you, if his son asks for bread, will give him a stone? **10**Or if he asks for a fish, will give him a snake? **11**If you, then, though you are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father in heaven give good gifts to those who ask him!"*

There has been a few questions that people normally have in their hearts but do bring on their tongue. Why does the prayers of some are answered immediately and of the others after a long time? Why is it some times we need to get together and prayer and some times even when we prayer alone our prayers are answered?

This the Lord explained me in a very beautifully according to my understanding. Let me try and put it to you in a simple way. The transactions in the Spiritual world (Kingdom of God) are like the transactions that happen in our banking world, here there is no money but something similar to money. The principal of banking in the



Spiritual world is not based on interest like in our world but on mercy. Some part of this is revealed in the parable that Jesus said in the Gospel according to Luke.

### **Luke 19**

<sup>12</sup>He said: "A man of noble birth went to a distant country to have himself appointed king and then to return. <sup>13</sup>So he called ten of his servants and gave them ten minas. 'Put this money to work,' he said, 'until I come back.'

<sup>14</sup>"But his subjects hated him and sent a delegation after him to say, 'We don't want this man to be our king.'

<sup>15</sup>"He was made king, however, and returned home. Then he sent for the servants to whom he had given the money, in order to find out what they had gained with it.

<sup>16</sup>"The first one came and said, 'Sir, your mina has earned ten more.'

<sup>17</sup>" 'Well done, my good servant!' his master replied. 'Because you have been trustworthy in a very small matter, take charge of ten cities.'

<sup>18</sup>"The second came and said, 'Sir, your mina has earned five more.'

<sup>19</sup>"His master answered, 'You take charge of five cities.'

<sup>20</sup>"Then another servant came and said, 'Sir, here is your mina; I have kept it laid away in a piece of cloth. <sup>21</sup>I was afraid of you, because you are a hard man. You take out what you did not put in and reap what you did not sow.'

<sup>22</sup>His master replied, 'I will judge you by your own words, you wicked servant! You knew, did you, that I am a hard man, taking out what I did not put in, and reaping what I did not sow? <sup>23</sup>Why then didn't you put my money on deposit, so that when I came back, I could have collected it with interest?'

<sup>24</sup>"Then he said to those standing by, 'Take his mina away from him and give it to the one who has ten minas.'

<sup>25</sup>" 'Sir,' they said, 'he already has ten!'

<sup>26</sup>"He replied, 'I tell you that to everyone who has, more will be given, but as for the one who has nothing, even what he has will be taken away. <sup>27</sup>But those enemies of mine who did not want me to be king over them—bring them here and kill them in front of me.'

Let me try and explain this to you. We all who are the children of God have a bank account in the Kingdom of God (heaven). In our account God makes an initial deposit on our behalf (like when we were small our earthly fathers did for us) and this deposit varies from person to person according to the job ahead of him (or her).

### **Philippians 4 [KJV]**

<sup>17</sup>Not because I desire a gift: but **I desire fruit that may abound to your account.**

<sup>19</sup>**But my God shall supply all your need according to his riches in glory by Christ Jesus.**

The money here is blessings which come from the good work that we do.

### **Acts 10**

<sup>4</sup>Cornelius stared at him in fear. "What is it, Lord?" he asked.

The angel answered, "**Your prayers and gifts to the poor have come up as a memorial offering before God.**

This does not mean only charity but also the work that we do in saving souls too. We may sow the seeds and another harvest but we do get our share when the harvest comes.

### **John 4 [KJV]**

<sup>37</sup>And herein is that saying true, **One soweth, and another reapeth.**

<sup>38</sup>**I sent you to reap that whereon ye bestowed no labour: other men laboured, and ye are entered into their labours.**



We can also add to our deposit when we labor in looking after others (like the sick, old, destitute etc.), when we fast and pray and when someone blesses us. We also add to this account in small amounts when we praise and worship God.

What ever we do it should not be with the intentions of getting rewarded here by the praises of people. If we get our reward from people then we do not add to our account in heaven.

### **Matthew 6**

*<sup>2</sup>So when you give to the needy, do not announce it with trumpets, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and on the streets, to be honored by men. I tell you the truth, they have received their reward in full. <sup>3</sup>But when you give to the needy, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, <sup>4</sup>so that your giving may be in secret. Then your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you.*

Now there is one rule that applies here unlike in our earthly banking world. When ever a deposit is made by us here, God on His behalf adds a similar amount but in multiples in your account (principal of mercy and the multiples varies for person to person and this too is done justly).

### **Exodus 33**

*<sup>19</sup>And the LORD said, "I will cause all my goodness to pass in front of you, and I will proclaim my name, the LORD, in your presence. **I will have mercy on whom I will have mercy, and I will have compassion on whom I will have compassion.***

### **1 Timothy 1**

*<sup>12</sup>I thank Christ Jesus our Lord, who has given me strength, that he considered me faithful, appointing me to his service. <sup>13</sup>Even though I was once a blasphemer and a persecutor and a violent man, I was shown mercy because I acted in ignorance and unbelief. <sup>14</sup>The grace of our Lord was poured out on me abundantly, along with the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus.*

### **Job 9**

*<sup>14</sup>How then can I dispute with him?  
How can I find words to argue with him?  
<sup>15</sup>Though I were innocent, I could not answer him;  
I could only plead with my Judge for mercy.  
<sup>16</sup>Even if I summoned him and he responded,  
I do not believe he would give me a hearing.  
<sup>17</sup>He would crush me with a storm  
and multiply my wounds for no reason.*

Whenever we pray and ask of God anything we withdraw from this account. The withdrawal is according to the request. If we do not have that balance we need to make a joint withdrawal from many accounts to get our request.

After the request if the person or persons benefited thanks God or bless us, a deposit is made into the accounts from which the withdrawals had been made. When the deposits are made God according to His mercy principal adds the multiples along with it. Therefore the more you do Gods work (without self interest) the more is deposited in your account. Withdrawals are also made from this account for angelatic protection. We can also transfer from our account to another persons account for a job, if it has been utilized well then we too benefit from that transaction (interceding with others).

Keeping an account not used for a long time may invite negative interest. We do not do any efforts on increasing our deposit then whatever we have in our account will one day be transferred to someone who has done a very good job. When we offend God by worshiping other gods an amount is removed from not only our account but also from the accounts of our four generations, but when we please God by keeping His commandments regular bonus amounts are added not only to our account but also to the accounts of our





thousand generations (like pension or Life Insurance Policies but here the returns start immediately and continue even after death to our generations).

### **Exodus 20**

*<sup>5</sup> You shall not bow down to them or worship them; for I, the LORD your God, am a jealous God, **punishing the children for the sin of the fathers to the third and fourth generation of those who hate me,** <sup>6</sup> **but showing love to a thousand {generations} of those who love me and keep my commandments.***

These regular incomes due to us for the many reasons are diverted to unbelievers when we do not keep the Word of God. (Wondered why the unbelievers are blessed so much? they should thank us not their gods for their gods are nothing.)

### **Deuteronomy 28**

*<sup>15</sup> However, **if you do not obey the LORD your God and do not carefully follow all his commands and decrees I am giving you today, all these curses will come upon you and overtake you:***

*<sup>43</sup> **The alien who lives among you will rise above you higher and higher, but you will sink lower and lower.***

*<sup>44</sup> **He will lend to you, but you will not lend to him. He will be the head, but you will be the tail.***

So do God's work of spreading His good news, of winning hearts for God, of looking after His people, praying for others etc. regularly. And then whenever you pray for anything (according to God's will) however big it may be, it will be answered.

Another way of add in your account other than sowing, or praying is also by suffering. There the amounts are small and therefore take time. This is reason that God answered the call of the Israelites after a very long time when they were in slavery under the Egyptians. For they had stopped worshiping God and went after other gods.

### **Exodus 1**

*<sup>8</sup> Then a new king, who did not know about Joseph, came to power in Egypt. <sup>9</sup> "Look," he said to his people, "the Israelites have become much too numerous for us. <sup>10</sup> Come, we must deal shrewdly with them or they will become even more numerous and, if war breaks out, will join our enemies, fight against us and leave the country."*

*<sup>11</sup> So they put slave masters over them to oppress them with forced labor, and they built Pithom and Rameses as store cities for Pharaoh. <sup>12</sup> But the more they were oppressed, the more they multiplied and spread; so the Egyptians came to dread the Israelites <sup>13</sup> and worked them ruthlessly. <sup>14</sup> **They made their lives bitter with hard labor in brick and mortar and with all kinds of work in the fields; in all their hard labor the Egyptians used them ruthlessly.***

### **Exodus 2**

*<sup>23</sup> **During that long period, (about 400 years) the king of Egypt died. The Israelites groaned in their slavery and cried out, and their cry for help because of their slavery went up to God.***

So you have an option to fill you account by doing God's work, worshipping Him, keeping His Word etc... or by suffering over a long period of time and then having you prayer answered by God.

I am telling you this not that you do the Lord's work and pray thinking about your account, but only that you are aware of such a system and do not stay poor in Spirit. So do not think of all the riches you have in this world but how rich you are in the Kingdom of God.
