

Knowledge, Wisdom and Understanding

There is a great confusion in man with regards to what is knowledge, wisdom and understanding. In the Holy Bible in the book of Hosea it is clearly written that man is suffering due to lack of knowledge and understanding.

Hosea 4:5pt-6pt

⁵ *You stumble day and night, and the prophets stumble with you.....*

⁶ *my people are destroyed from lack of knowledge. "Because you have rejected knowledge....."*

Hosea 4:14pt

¹⁴ *.... people without understanding will come to ruin!*

But when we share any revelation or speak to any person on a topic on the Word of God, regarding which they have little understanding then they will be quick to quote you **1 Corinthians 8:1**.

1 Corinthians 8:1pt

¹ *... We know that we all possess knowledge. [Or "We all possess knowledge," as you say] **Knowledge puffs up...***

These two scriptures put side by side seems to contradict each other. To add to it sin and death came into this world when Adam and Eve ate from the tree of knowledge of good and bad.

Genesis 2:15-17

¹⁵ *The LORD God took the man and put him in the Garden of Eden to work it and take care of it. ¹⁶*

*And the LORD God commanded the man, "You are free to eat from any tree in the garden; **17 but you must not eat from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, for when you eat of it you will surely die."***

Even the Israelites who were allowed entry to the promise land were the ones who did not have knowledge of good and bad.

Deuteronomy 1:39 [KJV]

³⁹ *Moreover your little ones, which ye said should be a prey, and your children, **which in that day had no knowledge between good and evil, they shall go in thither, and unto them will I give it, and they shall possess it.***

Through out the Bible it is written God hates yeast, which represented teachings and ways of man. So, it is very confusing, on one hand knowledge puffs up on the other hand people suffer due to lack of knowledge and understanding, man dies due to knowledge, losses due to knowledge and God warns against knowledge of good and bad.

It is not so only if you understand what is knowledge, wisdom and understanding.

To understand them we will take examples of people from the Holy Bible. To start with we take the first man on earth that is Adam whom God made an excellent body and mind in the start which due to sin became corruptible.

If you read in the book of Genesis after God made Adam and He made the other animals, birds and other creatures on earth. God bought them before Adam and Adam named each and every one of them. Can you imagine the number of spices of animal and birds that were there then, including the ones which are extinct today?

If I ask you to give new names to 10 objects immediately you will have great difficulty doing so. You know how much difficulty we have in choosing names for our children, forget about making new ones. Not only that, even when Eve was made and bought before Adam, Adam named her 'Woman' in Hebrew '**Ish shah**' which means **she-man** or **womb man**, (*a man with a womb*).

When Adam saw Eve he knew the parts of her body were different from his and he even knew what the parts of her body were made for. He could literally see through Eve and know the functions of the parts of her body.

Genesis 2:18-23

¹⁸ The LORD God said, "It is not good for the man to be alone. I will make a helper suitable for him."

¹⁹ Now the LORD God had formed out of the ground all the beasts of the field and all the birds of the air. He brought them to the man to see what he would name them; and whatever the man called each living creature, that was its name. ²⁰ So the man gave names to all the livestock, the birds of the air and all the beasts of the field.

But for Adam no suitable helper was found. ²¹ So the LORD God caused the man to fall into a deep sleep; and while he was sleeping, he took one of the man's ribs and closed up the place with flesh. ²² Then the LORD God made a woman from the rib he had taken out of the man, and he brought her to the man.

*²³ The man said,
"This is now bone of my bones
and flesh of my flesh;
she shall be called 'woman,'
for she was taken out of man."*

Now when God made man he had already given man great knowledge, wisdom and understanding. Even in the first book of Samuel the Lord is called a 'God of knowledge'.

1 Samuel 2:3

*³ Talk no more so exceeding proudly; let not arrogance come out of your mouth: **for the LORD is a God of knowledge**, and by him actions are weighed.*

You will also find that all the great prophets in the Old Testament and in New Testament the disciple including Paul had great knowledge, wisdom and understanding. Even Balaam of the Old Testament; who was a prophet and latter betrayed God, had great knowledge.

Numbers 24:15-16

¹⁵ And he took up his parable, and said, Balaam the son of Beor hath said, and the man whose eyes are open hath said:

¹⁶ He hath said, which heard the words of God, and knew the knowledge of the most High, which saw the vision of the Almighty, falling into a trance, but having his eyes open:

You should read his great prophecy which follows this scripture.

Coming to wisdom in the Old Testament, none had more wisdom than Solomon. If you read the book written by Solomon, you will get great insight into understanding wisdom.

Eccle 7:11,12,19-26

*¹¹ Wisdom, like an inheritance, is a good thing and **benefits those who see the sun.***

*¹² **Wisdom is a shelter** as money is a shelter, but the advantage of knowledge is this: that **wisdom preserves the life of its possessor***

*¹⁹ **Wisdom makes one wise man more powerful than ten rulers in a city.***

*²⁰ **There is not a righteous man on earth who does what is right and never sins.***

- ²¹ Do not pay attention to every word people say, or you may hear your servant cursing you—
²² for you know in your heart that many times you yourself have cursed others.
²³ All this I tested by wisdom and I said, "I am determined to be wise"— but this was beyond me.
²⁴ Whatever wisdom may be, it is far off and most profound— who can discover it?
²⁵ So I turned my mind to understand, to investigate and to search out wisdom and the scheme of things and to understand **the stupidity of wickedness and the madness of folly.**
²⁶ I find more bitter than death the woman who is a snare, whose heart is a trap and whose hands are chains. **The man who pleases God will escape her, but the sinner she will ensnare.**

Here Solomon says that ‘Wisdom, like an inheritance, a good thing and benefits those who see the sun’. Which means wisdom can be inherited from father to son and benefits those who want to progress in life. He also adds that wisdom preserves life of the one who has it and gives great power.

The next series of scripture are very interesting. Solomon says that a righteous man, who lives a life which is right in the eyes of God, is prone to sin. He goes on to explain the reason, as the one who is good says ‘Yes’ to every one and at the end lands up sinning. He explains that, we should use our wisdom and say ‘No’ when required.

So there will be times in your life when you will not turn the other cheek to the person, who slaps you on one, you will not go the extra mile when they ask you to go one.

Even Jesus said ‘No’ to the Pharisees and to Satan. We should use wisdom and decide when to say ‘Yes’ and when to say ‘NO’.

Solomon says it is very difficult to understand wisdom, to find it and measure it.

There is one line that really strikes me and describes a lot of people, ‘*stupidity of wickedness and the madness of folly*’. The stupidity of those who are wicked in heart, the people who know but yet due to the hardness of their heart do stupid things and madness of the fools, the foolish people who do not know therefore do mad things.

In the book of Job, Job writes that wisdom is very difficult to find. It is more precious than the treasures of this world. Destruction and Death, which is ‘evilness’ does not even know it exists.

Job 28:12-28

- ¹² **"But where can wisdom be found? Where does understanding dwell?"** ¹³ **Man does not comprehend its worth; it cannot be found in the land of the living.**
¹⁴ **The deep says, 'It is not in me'; the sea says, 'It is not with me.'**
¹⁵ **It cannot be bought with the finest gold, nor can its price be weighed in silver.**
¹⁶ **It cannot be bought with the gold of Ophir, with precious onyx or sapphires.**
¹⁷ **Neither gold nor crystal can compare with it, nor can it be had for jewels of gold.**
¹⁸ **Coral and jasper are not worthy of mention; the price of wisdom is beyond rubies.**
¹⁹ **The topaz of Cush cannot compare with it; it cannot be bought with pure gold.**
²⁰ **"Where then does wisdom come from? Where does understanding dwell?"**
²¹ **It is hidden from the eyes of every living thing, concealed even from the birds of the air.**
²² **Destruction and Death say, 'Only a rumor of it has reached our ears.'**
²³ **God understands the way to it and he alone knows where it dwells,**
²⁴ **for he views the ends of the earth and sees everything under the heavens.**
²⁵ **When he established the force of the wind and measured out the waters,**
²⁶ **when he made a decree for the rain and a path for the thunderstorm,**
²⁷ **then he looked at wisdom and appraised it; he confirmed it and tested it.**
²⁸ **And he said to man, 'The fear of the Lord—that is wisdom, and to shun evil is understanding.' "**

He goes on further to write; only God understands ‘wisdom’ and knows where it dwells. Using wisdom God created the Earth, the heavenly bodies, the weather, the seas, the clouds, the rains, their movements etc.. Which means everything on this earth was created by God using wisdom. So whatever exists on earth is made with a purpose, even the destructive forces.

God explains wisdom in a very simple yet a very complex sentence. *'The fear of the Lord—that is wisdom, and to shun evil is understanding.'*

The wise will understand how much little do they know and how little they are, therefore will fear the Lord, His judgment, His wrath and walk the path shown by Him, by shunning evil. God uses the word 'understanding'.

Now to explain what is Knowledge, Wisdom and Understanding in simple terms.

Knowledge means to know, to have information of, in computer lingo means having data. Wisdom to explain in computer lingo is like a software program that takes the data, which is knowledge, processes it and gives the result. Without data a program can not do anything. Without a program data is useless. The result that comes out is called understanding.

Like computer data/programs, there are good data/programs and junk data/ useless programs. Data/program that can help or data/program that has no relevant use just fills your hard disk and slows your computer. In the same way is knowledge and wisdom too, good wisdom with the right knowledge will give the perfect understanding. Like a bad program is called a virus in the same way bad wisdom is called wickedness, so wickedness with useless knowledge will give misunderstanding.

To understand this lets take some examples of people who possessed both, knowledge and wisdom. We will also understand how they received it. In the New Testament; Jesus is a good example to take and in the Old Testament; Solomon.

Mt 13:53-56

*⁵³When Jesus had finished these parables, he moved on from there. ⁵⁴Coming to his hometown, he began teaching the people in their synagogue, and they were amazed. **"Where did this man get this wisdom and these miraculous powers?"** they asked. ⁵⁵**"Isn't this the carpenter's son? Isn't his mother's name Mary, and aren't his brothers James, Joseph, Simon and Judas? ⁵⁶Aren't all his sisters with us? Where then did this man get all these things?"***

It is written that the people realized that Jesus possessed great wisdom. Now Jesus was born in a very poor family, his foster father was a carpenter. He had four brother and more than two sisters (it is written sisters not sister). Most people are miss lead that Jesus did not have brothers and sisters that those named here were cousins. If so then John the Baptize, who was a cousin of Jesus, was not named here even thou he was very famous and no where in the scriptures he is called 'brother of Jesus'.

The James named here was the same James who wrote the Letter of James of the New Testament. He was made the head of the church of Jerusalem. He was the first 'Bishop'.

Jesus was born of a Virgin; Mary by the power of the Holy Spirit; but it was not is God's plan that Mary needed to be a virgin forever. She was married to Joseph, and as God commanded all couples who join in holy matrimony to be fruitful and multiply. So they too loved each other as husband and wife and had a family. If you deny this then, that raises a lot of questions about their marriage life and they being a holy couple. For God said husbands submit to your wives and wives submit to your husbands and they obeyed.

Now imagine a carpenter providing for a family of minimum nine people. They surely did not have much. So where did Jesus get to learn the scripture if He did not go to a school to study. If you read Luke chapter 4, it says that Jesus was blessed with wisdom when He was born. He thirsted to for the knowledge of the scripture therefore never missed any opportunity to learn them.

Luke 2:40

⁴⁰And the child grew and became strong; he was filled with wisdom, and the grace of God was upon him.

Luke 2:43-49

*⁴³After the Feast was over, while his parents were returning home, **the boy Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem, but they were unaware of it.** ⁴⁴Thinking he was in their company, they traveled on for a day. Then they began looking for him among their relatives and friends. ⁴⁵When they did not find him, they went back to Jerusalem to look for him. ⁴⁶After three days **they found him in the temple courts, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions.** ⁴⁷Everyone who heard him was amazed at his understanding and his answers. ⁴⁸**When his parents saw him, they were astonished. His mother said to him, "Son, why have you treated us like this? Your father and I have been anxiously searching for you."***

⁴⁹"Why were you searching for me?" he asked. **"Didn't you know I had to be in my Father's house?"**
⁵⁰But they did not understand what he was saying to them.

Jesus is Lord, but on earth He came as man (100%). He too needed to learn the scriptures like we do. He never missed any opportunity to learn and yes He did get heavenly help, like we get today from the Holy Spirit, the 'Helper'.

Luke 2:51-52

⁵¹Then he went down to Nazareth with them and was obedient to them. But his mother treasured all these things in her heart. ⁵²And **Jesus grew in wisdom and stature, and in favor with God and men.**

Now lets' take the example of Solomon, let us understand how Solomon got wisdom and knowledge.

2 Chronicles 1:7-13

⁷ That night **God appeared to Solomon** and said to him, **"Ask for whatever you want me to give you."**
⁸ Solomon answered God, **"You have shown great kindness to David my father and have made me king in his place. ⁹ Now, LORD God, let your promise to my father David be confirmed, for you have made me king over a people who are as numerous as the dust of the earth. ¹⁰ Give me wisdom and knowledge, that I may lead this people, for who is able to govern this great people of yours?"**
¹¹ God said to Solomon, **"Since this is your heart's desire and you have not asked for wealth, riches or honor, nor for the death of your enemies, and since you have not asked for a long life but for wisdom and knowledge to govern my people over whom I have made you king, ¹² therefore wisdom and knowledge will be given you. And I will also give you wealth, riches and honor, such as no king who was before you ever had and none after you will have."**
¹³ Then Solomon went to Jerusalem from the high place at Gibeon, from before the Tent of Meeting. And he reigned over Israel.

Here in the second book of Chronicles it is written that when God appeared to Solomon, God asked him to wish for anything and God will grant him. Solomon did not ask for anything of this world but he asked for wisdom and knowledge. God was pleased with him and granted him not only wisdom and knowledge but also wealth, riches and honor more than any king who existed or any who will ever exist along with wisdom and knowledge. Solomon got his wish for only one reason and which you will understand when you read the previous 6 lines of the scripture.

2 Chronicles 1:1-6

¹And Solomon the son of David was strengthened in his kingdom, and the LORD his God was with him, and magnified him exceedingly.
²Then Solomon spake unto all Israel, to the captains of thousands and of hundreds, and to the judges, and to every governor in all Israel, the chief of the fathers.
³**So Solomon, and all the congregation with him, went to the high place that was at Gibeon; for there was the tabernacle of the congregation of God, which Moses the servant of the LORD had made in the wilderness.**
⁴But the ark of God had David brought up from Kirjathjearim to the place which David had prepared for it: for he had pitched a tent for it at Jerusalem.
⁵**Moreover the brasen altar, that Bezaleel the son of Uri, the son of Hur, had made, he put before the tabernacle of the LORD: and Solomon and the congregation sought unto it.**
⁶**And Solomon went up thither to the brasen altar before the LORD, which was at the tabernacle of the congregation, and offered a thousand burnt offerings upon it.**

When Solomon pleased God by doing what is right in the eyes of God, God grant him, his hearts desire. So here we understand that wisdom and knowledge is gift that God can give you if you do what is right in the eyes of God, by keeping His commandments.

Something that will surprise you is, Solomon had before this moment already possessed wisdom and knowledge and that too, God Himself had given him. This is written in the first book of Kings, which

comes before Chronicles. And here too Solomon receives these gifts because he pleases God by imitating his father David, who was a great example of a person walking in the righteousness of God.

1 Kings 3:3-15

³*And Solomon loved the LORD, walking in the statutes of David his father: only he sacrificed and burnt incense in high places.*

⁴*And the king went to Gibeon to sacrifice there; for that was the great high place: a thousand burnt offerings did Solomon offer upon that altar.*

⁵*In Gibeon the LORD appeared to Solomon in a dream by night: and God said, Ask what I shall give thee.*

⁶*And Solomon said, Thou hast shewed unto thy servant David my father great mercy, according as he walked before thee in truth, and in righteousness, and in uprightness of heart with thee; and thou hast kept for him this great kindness, that thou hast given him a son to sit on his throne, as it is this day.*

⁷*And now, O LORD my God, thou hast made thy servant king instead of David my father: and I am but a little child: I know not how to go out or come in.*

⁸*And thy servant is in the midst of thy people which thou hast chosen, a great people, that cannot be numbered nor counted for multitude.*

⁹*Give therefore thy servant an understanding heart to judge thy people, that I may discern between good and bad: for who is able to judge this thy so great a people?*

¹⁰*And the speech pleased the LORD, that Solomon had asked this thing.*

¹¹*And God said unto him, Because thou hast asked this thing, and hast not asked for thyself long life; neither hast asked riches for thyself, nor hast asked the life of thine enemies; but hast asked for thyself understanding to discern judgment;*

¹²*Behold, I have done according to thy words: lo, I have given thee a wise and an understanding heart; so that there was none like thee before thee, neither after thee shall any arise like unto thee.*

¹³*And I have also given thee that which thou hast not asked, both riches, and honour: so that there shall not be any among the kings like unto thee all thy days.*

¹⁴*And if thou wilt walk in my ways, to keep my statutes and my commandments, as thy father David did walk, then I will lengthen thy days.*

¹⁵*And Solomon awoke; and, behold, it was a dream. And he came to Jerusalem, and stood before the ark of the covenant of the LORD, and offered up burnt offerings, and offered peace offerings, and made a feast to all his servants.*

We can preach about God and speak a thousand words from the Bible, but the easiest way to change people is to live the Word, set yourselves as examples of a good Christian. Parents complain about their children, but they do not realize that the children are imitating them. So before you complain please look in the mirror and ask, what example have I set for my children to follow?

Then what did happen? Did Solomon forget he had wisdom and knowledge, or did God forget that He had given them to Solomon?

1 Kings 4:29-34

²⁹*God gave Solomon wisdom and very great insight, and a breadth of understanding as measureless as the sand on the seashore.* ³⁰*Solomon's wisdom was greater than the wisdom of all the men of the East, and greater than all the wisdom of Egypt.* ³¹*He was wiser than any other man, including Ethan the Ezrahite—wiser than Heman, Calcol and Darda, the sons of Mahol. And his fame spread to all the surrounding nations.* ³²*He spoke three thousand proverbs and his songs numbered a thousand and five.* ³³*He described plant life, from the cedar of Lebanon to the hyssop that grows out of walls. He also taught about animals and birds, reptiles and fish.* ³⁴*Men of all nations came to listen to Solomon's wisdom, sent by all the kings of the world, who had heard of his wisdom.*

Here it is written that Solomon had the knowledge of the world and knew all things pertaining to the world. He asked God for the wisdom and knowledge to discern between good and bad. This is the same fruit that Adam and Eve ate in the Garden of Eden. This is same which Paul says in 1 Corinthians 8:1 that puffs man.

God gave these gifts to Solomon because he asked for them; at this time Solomon did not know that there was a different kind of wisdom and knowledge available.

In the second book of Chronicles chapter 1, Solomon asks God for the wisdom and knowledge of the Kingdom of God, the Spiritual world, the Heavenly world.

Now we can summarize the kinds of knowledge. The knowledge of this world, that is worldly knowledge and the knowledge of the Kingdom of God, which is knowledge of the Host High. The same is with wisdom.

God knows that this worldly knowledge and wisdom is not going to help us in any way. This does not mean that we should not study or go to school. Even God permitted yeast in one of the sacrifices, a sacrifice that was offered as a community, it was a thanksgiving sacrifice. God knows that man needs the worldly knowledge to survive among other people, but God warns against letting it go to your head.

The worldly knowledge and wisdom helps us to discern things of this world according to man. The wisdom and knowledge of the Kingdom of God helps us discern things of the spiritual world. Things first exist or start in the spiritual then they manifest in the natural world. So you can receive, discern or destroy things even before they come to existence in the natural world, if you have the wisdom and knowledge of the Kingdom of the Host High.

Like you get worldly knowledge by reading books of the natural world so also you get the knowledge of the Kingdom of God by reading the Word of God.

As for wisdom, wisdom of the natural world can be received like the wisdom of the Kingdom of God as a gift from God like Solomon did, or by experience. That is why we need to listen to the advice of the elders because they have more experience than us. This worldly wisdom can be inherited by listening to your elders.

Are there other ways of getting wisdom and knowledge? Let's find out.

In the Genesis chapter 39 it is written that the Lord was with Joseph therefore he was successful in everything he did.

Gen 39:1-6

¹ Now Joseph had been taken down to Egypt. Potiphar, an Egyptian who was one of Pharaoh's officials, the captain of the guard, bought him from the Ishmaelites who had taken him there.

² **The LORD was with Joseph and he prospered, and he lived in the house of his Egyptian master.** ³ When his master saw that **the LORD was with him and that the LORD gave him success in everything he did,** ⁴ Joseph found favor in his eyes and became his attendant. Potiphar put him in charge of his household, and he entrusted to his care everything he owned. ⁵ From the time he put him in charge of his household and of all that he owned, the LORD blessed the household of the Egyptian because of Joseph. The blessing of the LORD was on everything Potiphar had, both in the house and in the field. ⁶ So he left in Joseph's care everything he had; with Joseph in charge, he did not concern himself with anything except the food he ate.

A person is successful if he does the task right. To do a task right one needs to know, therefore the Lord was with Joseph and gave him wisdom and knowledge to do all things right and successful. The Lord is with you if you believe in Him, love Him, worship Him and keep His commandments.

The same is written in the book of Daniel chapter 1, here it is even specified that the one who is a believer, is ten times wiser than the non-believers.

Daniel 1:18-20

¹⁸ At the end of the time set by the king to bring them in, the chief official presented them to Nebuchadnezzar. ¹⁹ The king talked with them, and **he found none equal to Daniel, Hananiah, Mishael and Azariah;** so they entered the king's service. ²⁰ **In every matter of wisdom and understanding about which the king questioned them, he found them ten times better than all the magicians and enchanters in his whole kingdom**

If you look around and you find non-believers smarter than you, you better find out how to improve your relation with God.



In the book of Exodus chapter 31, the Lord put His Spirit on Bezalel and gave him all the knowledge and skill of the crafts and materials that he can be able to complete the task set for him, to construct the Tabernacle.

Exodus 31:1-4

¹ Then the LORD said to Moses, ² "See, I have chosen Bezalel son of Uri, the son of Hur, of the tribe of Judah, ³ and I have filled him with the Spirit of God, with skill, ability and knowledge in all kinds of crafts- ⁴ to make artistic designs for work in gold, silver and bronze, ⁵ to cut and set stones, to work in wood, and to engage in all kinds of craftsmanship.

When we confess Luke 4:18 'The Spirit of the Lord is upon me for God Himself has anointed me', we receive the anointing and therefore get all the wisdom and knowledge to complete the task before us. Does that mean that we do not have to learn or go to college? No. Even Jesus who was Christ ('The Anointed One') as a child thirsted to know more of the scriptures by listening, asking questions and sharing with the learned.

When we live our lives right in the eyes of God, God blesses us with wisdom. When we reject evil and keep our selves holy, God bless us with wisdom.

Psalms 37: 27-31

²⁷ Turn from evil and do good; then you will dwell in the land forever.
²⁸ For the LORD loves the just and will not forsake his faithful ones. They will be protected forever, but the offspring of the wicked will be cut off;
²⁹ the righteous will inherit the land and dwell in it forever.
³⁰ The mouth of the righteous man utters wisdom, and his tongue speaks what is just.
³¹ The law of his God is in his heart; his feet do not slip.

When we receive the baptism of the Holy Spirit we realize that we automatically do things much better. (Read Baptism – Solid Food)

Proverbs 1:20-33

²⁰ Wisdom calls aloud in the street, she raises her voice in the public squares; ²¹ at the head of the noisy streets she cries out, in the gateways of the city she makes her speech:
²² "How long will you simple ones love your simple ways? How long will mockers delight in mockery and fools hate knowledge?
²³ If you had responded to my rebuke, I would have poured out my heart to you and made my thoughts known to you.
²⁴ But since you rejected me when I called and no one gave heed when I stretched out my hand, ²⁵ since you ignored all my advice and would not accept my rebuke, ²⁶ I in turn will laugh at your disaster; I will mock when calamity overtakes you- ²⁷ when calamity overtakes you like a storm, when disaster sweeps over you like a whirlwind, when distress and trouble overwhelm you.
²⁸ "Then they will call to me but I will not answer; they will look for me but will not find me.
²⁹ Since they hated knowledge and did not choose to fear the LORD, ³⁰ since they would not accept my advice and spurned my rebuke, ³¹ they will eat the fruit of their ways and be filled with the fruit of their schemes.
³² For the waywardness of the simple will kill them, and the complacency of fools will destroy them; ³³ but whoever listens to me will live in safety and be at ease, without fear of harm."

People, who reject wisdom and want to live a simple life, suffer. I am speaking to simple spiritual lives, when one feels he or she need not know more about God or about the Kingdom of Heaven, about His sacrifice on the cross and about the Salvation available to him or her.

Proverbs 3: 13-25, 35

¹³ Blessed is the man who finds wisdom, the man who gains understanding, ¹⁴ for she is more profitable than silver and yields better returns than gold.

- ¹⁵ *She is more precious than rubies; nothing you desire can compare with her.*
¹⁶ ***Long life is in her right hand; in her left hand are riches and honor.***
¹⁷ *Her ways are pleasant ways, and all her paths are peace.*
¹⁸ *She is a tree of life to those who embrace her; those who lay hold of her will be blessed.*
¹⁹ ***By wisdom the LORD laid the earth's foundations, by understanding he set the heavens in place; 20 by his knowledge the deeps were divided, and the clouds let drop the dew.***
²¹ *My son, preserve sound judgment and discernment, do not let them out of your sight; ²² they will be life for you, an ornament to grace your neck.*
²³ ***Then you will go on your way in safety, and your foot will not stumble; ²⁴ when you lie down, you will not be afraid; when you lie down, your sleep will be sweet.***
²⁵ ***Have no fear of sudden disaster or of the ruin that overtakes the wicked, ²⁶ for the LORD will be your confidence and will keep your foot from being snared.***

³⁵ ***The wise inherit honor, but fools he holds up to shame.***

A person who is wise will know that the wisdom he or she possesses is only compared to a pot of water and the sea. The Wisdom of God can not be measured, what we receive and what Solomon received was only a very, very, very small quantity. In our natural life we just can not receive the Wisdom of God in full. When a person feels he is really wise by his own self than he is worst than a fool and there is no hope for him at all.

Proverbs 26:12

¹² ***Do you see a man wise in his own eyes? There is more hope for a fool than for him.***

When the anointing of the Lord is on you, the Spirit of God teaches you and you will find that you are able to understand every much better. You are able to discern things well and you stop fearing of anything of this world. You stop fearing about the future, nor about your health.

1 John 2:27

²⁷ ***As for you, the anointing you received from him remains in you, and you do not need anyone to teach you. But as his anointing teaches you about all things and as that anointing is real, not counterfeit—just as it has taught you, remain in him.***

Luke 24:45

⁴⁴ ***He said to them, "This is what I told you while I was still with you: Everything must be fulfilled that is written about me in the Law of Moses, the Prophets and the Psalms."***

⁴⁵ ***Then he opened their minds so they could understand the Scriptures.***

Psalm 94:10-13

¹⁰ ***Does he who disciplines nations not punish?
Does he who teaches man lack knowledge?***

¹¹ ***The LORD knows the thoughts of man;
he knows that they are futile.***

¹² ***Blessed is the man you discipline, O LORD,
the man you teach from your law;***

¹³ ***you grant him relief from days of trouble,
till a pit is dug for the wicked.***
